



- All range maps have been synced and updated thanks to our friends at the Digital Atlas of the Virginia Flora.




Flora Ambassadors Take Root:

Volunteers Expand Knowledge and Impact Across Virginia

We extend our heartfelt thanks to all the volunteers who dedicated their time, energy, and enthusiasm to make the Flora of Virginia Ambassador Program a success. Your efforts strengthened our botanical community and expanded the reach of the Flora of Virginia App, empowering others to engage deeply with Virginia's flora.

In 2024, the Flora of Virginia Project (FlVA) launched its Ambassador Program to cultivate a network of power users skilled in teaching others how to maximize the Flora App's potential. In partnership with the Virginia Master Naturalist (VMN) Program, FlVA hosted webinars, led field labs, and provided guidance for members to develop and run their own programs.

Key Program Highlights

- 177 participants attended the introductory webinar.
- 83 registrants continued with the Ambassador Program.
- 54 completed assignments, and 40 participated in field labs.
- 22 participants completed all requirements and are now certified Ambassadors.



Contributions from Master Naturalists

- 35 volunteers reported 262 service or training hours in total.
- 13 VMN chapters reported participation by at least one member.

Programming by Ambassadors

Flora Ambassadors have facilitated nine educational and outreach activities, including presentations, classes and walks for the Eastern Shore VMN, Headwaters VNPS, and VMN Riverine Chapter, the Richmond area Wild Ones, and at First Landing State Park, Lewis Ginter Botanical Garden, Edith J. Carrier Arboretum, the State Fair of Virginia, and Quarry Gardens.

These initiatives exemplify the passion and commitment of our volunteers, who are helping to promote Virginia's botanical heritage far and wide.
